

## Notes: Verbs

- Verb- an action
- Subject- the person/thing doing the action
- Infinitive- verb that ends in -er, -ar, or -ir. Means “to [action]”  
example: comer = to eat , cantar = to sing, escribir = to write
- Conjugate- (action) to change the ending of an infinitive to agree with it’s subject

### How to Conjugate a Verb:

1. Take the -ER off the infinitive.  
infinitive = verb with -ER on the end, means “to [action]”
2. Look at the subject and choose the correct ending.
3. Add the ending.

*Ex: Conjugate the verb “comer.”*

Yo como,

Tu comes,

El/Ella come,

Nosotros comemos,

Ellos comen.

### Present Tense Endings for Verbs

Subject	-AR ending	-ER, -IR ending	Subject	-AR ending	-ER, -IR ending
Yo (I)	-O	-O	Nosotros (We)	-AMOS	-EMOS -IMOS
Tu (You)	-AS	-ES			
El, Ella (He, She) Usted (You, formal)	-A	-E	Ellos (They), Ustedes (You guys)	-AN	-EN
