Notes: Verbs

- <u>Verb-</u>an action
- <u>Subject-</u> the person/thing doing the action
- <u>Infinitive-</u> verb that ends in -er, -ar, or -ir. Means "to [action]" example: comer = to eat, cantar = to sing, escribir = to write
- <u>Conjugate-</u> (action) to change the ending of an infinitive to agree with it's subject How to Conjugate a Verb:
 - 1. Take the -ER off the infinitive.
 - infinitive = verb with -ER on the end, means "to [action]"
 - 2. Look at the subject and choose the correct ending.
 - 3. Add the ending.

Ex: Conjugate the verb "comer." Yo com<u>o</u>, Tu com<u>es</u>, El/Ella com<u>e</u>, Nosotros com<u>emos</u>, Ellos com<u>en</u>.
